This program is a collaboration between faculty, undergraduate learning assistants and this GA to use learning science research, pedagogy, and tutoring best practices to promote foundational math success at UNM. This position supports academic programs through non-credit generating duties and responsibilities.</p> <p>The successful candidate will provide a range of technical and operational support for our Foundational Math Learning Assistance program.
