Position Summary:	<p>Student Learning Assistance at the Center for Teaching and Learning seeks a Graduate Assistant with the desire and ability to assist in the development of a peer-to-peer educational program. This program is dedicated to learning science research, pedagogy, and tutoring best practices that promote student learning at UNM. This position supports academic programs through non-credit generating duties and responsibilities.</p> <p>The successful candidate will provide a range of technical and operational support for the Supplemental Instruction program. This support includes training instruction, maintaining stakeholder partnerships, researching and implementing innovative pedagogical practices, and developing resources to make our services accessible to a universal audience.</p> <p>The anticipated work schedule is 20 hours per week, Monday through Friday between 8am and 5pm.</p>

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Research and develop training on pedagogy, learning development, and professional development for undergraduate and graduate student staff.
- Facilitate training instruction for Supplemental Instruction Leaders (tutors) who support a variety of undergraduate courses, including Biology, Chemistry, Linguistics, Economics, and Physics.
- Collaborate with the Student Success Supervisor on data reporting for academic programs and the Provost as needed.
- Collaborate with the Student Success Supervisor to develop partnerships with key stakeholders, including but not limited to a variety of faculty, the BA/MD Program, and the College of Arts and Sciences.
- Collaborate with Student Success Supervisor to strategize ways to streamline services and make them accessible to all UNM students.
- Research current trends in higher education to ensure program effectiveness and relevance.

Qualifications:

- Experience managing a tutoring and/or educational program for adult learners.
- Experience developing and facilitating instruction focused on learning science and best pedagogical practices.
- Effective organizational skills with an ability to manage multiple responsibilities.
- Ability to analyze and trend data to help improve student performance and program outcomes.
- Ability to work collaboratively and cooperatively with a diverse team of peers and professionals.
- Excellent oral, written, and interpersonal communication skills.
- Demonstrated leadership skills, initiative, ability to work independently, and enthusiasm for learning.
- Proficient in Microsoft 365 and other digital environments such as Canvas, Zoom, Adobe, etc.
- Experience mentoring or coaching students.

To be employed as a graduate assistant, the selected candidate must meet the following criteria:

- Formally admitted to a graduate program at the University of New Mexico.
- A graduate student in good standing determined in the sole discretion of UNM administration.
- For Fall and Spring semester, maintain enrollment at the University of New Mexico for a minimum of 6 hours of course work, thesis, or dissertation hours that count toward the graduate degree.

- A 3.0 grade point average in graduate coursework each semester.
- Within the time limit, as specified in the UNM Graduate Catalog, for completion of the degree sought.
